# **COMPLAINT**

Plaintiffs, GHASSAN MANSOUR, ABBAS HASHEMI, AND HAMID FARAJI ("Plaintiffs"), collectively as Trustees of the Islamic Education Center of Tampa, Inc., AND ISLAMIC EDUCATION CENTER OF TAMPA, INC. ("IEC") sue Defendants, AKRAM JAWAD, SALAH HARAKI, PERVIZ KHOSHNOODI, AND JABBAR AL-MASHADANI ("Defendants"), and allege:

# JURISDICTION AND VENUE

1. As to each cause of action set forth herein, this is a cause of action in which: (a)

the amount in controversy is in excess of \$15,000.00, exclusive of costs, interest and attorney's

fees, or (b) the Plaintiffs are requesting equitable relief in reference to the subject matter of this

Complaint. This Court therefore has jurisdiction pursuant to Florida Statute §26.012.

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2. As to each cause of action set forth herein, this is a cause of action that arose in Hillsborough County, Florida, and where one or more of the Defendants are located. Venue is therefore proper in Hillsborough County, Florida pursuant to Florida Statute §47.011.

3. Pursuant to Administrative Order A-2007-004, this matter is subject to the jurisdiction of the Complex Business Litigation Division since it is an action arising from the internal affairs or governance, dissolution or liquidation rights, obligations between or among owners (shareholders, partners, members), or liability or indemnity of managers (officers, directors, managers, trustees, or members or partners functioning as managers) of corporations, partnerships, limited partnerships, limited liability companies or partnerships.

4. ISLAMIC EDUCATION CENTER OF TAMPA, INC. is a corporation with its principal place of business in Hillsborough County, Florida.

5. AKRAM JAWAD is an individual, *sui juris*, who resides in Hillsborough County, Florida.

6. SALAH HARAKI is an individual, *sui juris,* who resides in Hillsborough County, Florida.

7. PERVIZ KHOSHNOODI is an individual, *sui juris*, who resides in Hillsborough County, Florida.

8. JABBAR AL-MASHADANI is an individual, *sui juris*, who resides in Hillsborough County, Florida.

### STATEMENT OF THE FACTS

9. The IEC was founded in 1993 as a non-profit religious organization. A Copy of the Articles of Incorporation are attached hereto as **Exhibit "A"** and are incorporated herein by reference.

10. The Plaintiffs were amongst the original founding members of the IEC. The Plaintiffs assisted and contributed greatly to the establishment of the IEC as a preeminent religious organization within their community.

11. The Plaintiffs were elected by a majority of the IEC members as Trustees with a permanent duration pursuant to the terms of the Constitution. The Constitution of the IEC, adopted on September 25, 1993, determines the manner in which the organization shall be governed. A Copy of the Constitution to which reference is herein made is attached hereto as **Exhibit "B"**, is incorporated herein by reference, and shall hereinafter be referred to as the "Constitution".

12. The term of office for the Trustees is provided within Section 5.3.4 of the Constitution as follows:

All trustees, except the one elected from the Board of Directors, are permanent positions. However, if one or more of the permanent positions becomes empty due to death, resignation, loss of qualification, etc., the new trustee(s) shall be suggested by the Board of Directors and approved by the advisory A'lim.

13. None of the Trustee positions occupied by the Plaintiffs became empty due to death, resignation, or loss of qualification.

14. On or about August 17, 2002 a dissenting faction of the IEC members had a meeting wherein they, *ultra vires*, took action in an attempt to amend the Constitution.

15. The dissenting members failed to follow the proper procedures to amend the Constitution as set forth therein.

16. Article 7 of the Constitution provides the proper procedures by which the Constitution may be amended or repealed:

7.1 Amendments to this constitution shall only be considered if it can be determined that they will better achieve the purpose of the IEC. Such amendments shall be proposed, in writing, to the Board by two or more members of the IEC. Approval of the amendments shall be authorized by the A'lim and trustees and submitted to the Board of Directors before ratification by the General Body.

7.2 A two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the total active members shall constitute ratification to the amendments as described in the Bylaws.

17. In an *ultra vires* effort to oust the Plaintiffs as the rightful Trustees, one of the purported amendments sought by the dissenting members attempted to modify the term of office for the Trustees.

18. The dissenting IEC members from time to time have been lead by a group that has sought to establish control of the IEC as the Board of Directors.

19. The Board of Directors prepared correspondence to the members dated August 25, 2002 summarizing the purported amendments to the Constitution. A Copy of the aforementioned correspondence to which reference is herein made is attached hereto as **Exhibit** "C", and is incorporated herein by reference.

20. Thereafter the Board of Directors sought to hold an election to elect new Trustees.

A Copy of the correspondence referencing this process is attached hereto as **Exhibit "D"**, and is incorporated herein by reference.

21. Prior to the *ultra vires* amendment of the Constitution and election of Trustees, the Plaintiffs were the rightful Trustees of the IEC.

22. The Plaintiffs remain to be the true and rightful Trustees of the IEC.

23. The Plaintiffs prepared correspondence dated September 7, 2002 to the members informing the dissenting members that their recent actions, in contravention of the Constitutional

provisions, were deemed void and without effect. A Copy of the aforementioned correspondence to which reference is herein made is attached hereto as **Exhibit "E"**, and is incorporated herein by reference.

24. The largest asset of the IEC is the real property and improvements thereon identified in the legal description attached hereto as **Exhibit "F"** ("the Property"). The Property is currently the subject of an eminent domain action initiated by the State of Florida, Department of Transportation ("DOT") in Case No. 07-8832 pending in this Court.

25. The Plaintiffs were the only representatives of the IEC during the negotiation process with the DOT in reference to the taking of the Property.

26. The Plaintiffs, through protracted negotiations, were able to negotiate a significant increase in the original offer to purchase the Property from \$1,600,000.00 to \$2,100,000.00.

27. Upon information and belief, after protracted negotiations by the Plaintiffs with the DOT for the betterment of the IEC members, the Defendants took efforts to undermine the authority of the Plaintiffs with the IEC members as well as the DOT.

28. Upon information and belief, the Defendants, in attempt to exert their control over the assets of the IEC for personal gain, began contacting the DOT and represented that they were in control of the assets of the IEC.

29. Upon information and belief, the Defendants attempted to negotiate the sale of the Property with the DOT for \$1,600,000.00, however they were prevented from doing so because the Property had been conveyed by the Plaintiffs for safe-keeping to the Islamic Education Center, Inc., an associated religious organization in Maryland.

30. Upon information and belief, which is corroborated by the Annual Report filed with the Florida Secretary of State, the Defendants have attempted to exert control of the IEC as

the Board of Directors. A Copy of the aforementioned report to which reference is herein made is attached hereto as **Exhibit "G"**, is incorporated herein by reference, and shall hereinafter be referred to as the "Annual Report".

31. Due to the Defendants *ultra vires* actions to improperly modify the IEC's Annual Report, the Plaintiffs were no longer permitted to negotiate the sale of the Property with the DOT, and the DOT was forced to file the aforementioned action.

32. Any attempt by the Defendants to exert control over the assets of the IEC is *ultra vires* and not otherwise permitted by the Constitution.

33. Article 5 of the Constitution provides from the following organizational hierarchy

beginning with (a) the level of most importance to (f) least:

- a. Advisor,
- b. Resident A'lim,
- c. Trustees,
- d. General Body,
- e. Board of Directors, and
- f. Project Committees.

34. The description of the Trustees' responsibilities within the organization is

provided within Sections 5.3.1 and 5.3.3 of the Constitution:

5.3.1 The trustees shall be the keepers of the IEC's long term assets such as the real estate, on behalf of the Leader with whom the ultimate authority of the assets resides. There shall be five trustees chosen as follows:

1) The advisory A'lim

2) Three trustees elected by the Board of Directors and Approved by the advisory A'lim

3) One trustee elected from the Board of Directors by the Directors for the period of their term.

5.3.3

1) Supervise the execution and the continuity of the activities planned by the Board of Directors according to the Constitution.

2) Serve as the link between the Leadership and the Board of Director (sic) and community in addition to being the link with the State of Florida.

3) Resolve and diffuse all obstacles and personal conflicts among the Board of Directors, community and/or the A'lim.

4) Should meet bi-annually before the General Assembly to review the bi-annual report submitted by the board of Directors for approval before reading it the General Assembly.5) Oversee the whole election process and supervise any change in the constitution.

35. The Plaintiffs are the true and rightful Trustees of the IEC and as such should be permitted control of its assets for the betterment of its members.

### <u>Count I</u> <u>Declaratory Relief</u>

36. This is an action against the Defendants for declaratory relief, filed pursuant to Florida Statute 86.011 et seq., in reference to the Plaintiffs' rights as Trustees and members of the IEC pursuant to the Constitution.

37. The Plaintiffs incorporate the allegations set forth in paragraphs one (1) through thirty five (35) above as if fully set forth herein.

38. The Plaintiffs require a determination of their respective rights, powers, and privileges with respect to their positions as Trustees within the IEC.

39. The Plaintiffs require a determination of their respective rights, powers, and privileges with regard to the foregoing, and it is noted that the Defendants take a position diametrically opposed to the Plaintiffs in this regard.

40. A genuine controversy is pending between the parties to this cause that must be fully adjudicated in order for the management and control of the IEC to be resolved.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully pray this Court:

a. Render a declaratory judgment that the attempted amendment of the Constitution was unlawful, and in violation of the Constitution of the IEC and that the Plaintiffs are the true and rightful and Trustees;

- Render a declaratory judgment that any and all actions taken inconsistent with the provisions of the Constitution are invalid and without effect;
- c. Pending the rendition of such declaratory judgment, enjoin defendants from holding, or attempting to hold, or permitting the holding of any elections for Trustees, Directors, or otherwise;
- d. Pending the rendition of such declaratory judgment, enjoin defendants from taking any other actions inconsistent with the provisions of the Constitution;
- e. Award Plaintiffs the costs of this action; and
- f. Award such other and further relief as to the Court seems proper.

# <u>Count II</u> Injunction

41. The Plaintiffs incorporate the allegations set forth in paragraphs one (1) through thirty five (35) above as if fully set forth herein.

42. The Plaintiffs have improperly and *ultra vires* been denied their proper positions as Trustees within the IEC.

43. The Defendants have, unlawfully and in contravention of the Constitution, attempted to exert total and complete control over the assets of the IEC including the Property.

44. Because of the Defendants' actions as set forth above, Plaintiff and those members of the public doing business with the Tax Collector have suffered and will continue to suffer irreparable injury, which cannot be cured by monetary damages alone.

45. Plaintiffs have a clear, legal right to injunctive relief against all of the Defendants. Injunctive relief is particularly appropriate where, as is the case here, Defendants will continue to cause injury to the Plaintiffs.

- 46. Plaintiffs lack an adequate remedy at law.
- 47. Issuance of an injunction is sought to best serve the interests of the IEC members.
- 48. Fairness, equity, and justice require the issuance of an injunction against the

# Defendants.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully pray this Court:

- a. Render judgment against all Defendants for injunctive relief, temporarily and permanently enjoining all Defendants, their successors, assigns, agents, employees, representatives, any person or entity acting on the behalf of any of the Defendants from breaching or causing, either directly or indirectly, the breach of any term or provision within the Constitution;
- b. Render judgment against all Defendants for injunctive relief, temporarily and permanently enjoining all Defendants, their successors, assigns, agents, employees, representatives, any person or entity acting on the behalf of any of the Defendants from making any use of IEC assets, whether or not such use would be deemed waste according to applicable law;
- c. Award Plaintiffs the costs of this action; and
- d. Award such other and further relief as to the Court seems proper.

# COUNT III Receivership

49. This is an action for appointment of a receiver to take possession and control of the IEC during the pendency of this cause.

50. The Plaintiffs incorporate the allegations set forth in paragraphs one (1) through thirty five (35) above as if fully set forth herein.

51. The Plaintiffs as members and trustees have an interest in the IEC.

52. The Plaintiffs' interests along with interests of all IEC members have been jeopardized and will continue to be jeopardized until such time that the Court determines the respective interests of the parties.

53. Plaintiffs lack an adequate remedy at law.

54. There is a substantial likelihood that Plaintiffs will prevail upon the merits of this action against the Defendants.

55. A nominal bond should be required, since the Defendants do not stand to suffer any damages upon the appointment of a receiver.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully pray this Court appoint a receiver for the pendency of this cause, with such receiver to have broad powers to control the assets and affairs of the IEC and to serve for a nominal fee with a bond.



# Article 4. MEMBERSHIP

### 4.1 Qualifications

4.1.1 Any individual, aged 18 years or older, who believes in and endeavors to practice the Islamic way of life, shall qualify to become a member of the IEC by fulfilling the following conditions:

4.1.1.1 Agree with the Constitution of the IEC.

4.1.1.2 Be recommended by two (2) active members and approved by the Board of Directors of the IEC.

4.1.1.3 Love Mohammad and his descendants (Peace be upon them) and follow their teachings.

4.1.2 Every member shall be obligated to perform the duties and responsibilities as mentioned in Section 4.2 of this Article. The classification of membership is detailed in the Bylaws.

# 4.2 Duties and Responsibilities

4.2.1 A member of the IEC shall become eligible to vote after six month of active membership in accordance with the Articles of this Constitution. To be considered active, a member shall continue to perform the following duties and responsibilities:

4.2.1.1 Stay well acquainted with the IEC's Constitution and not work or act contrary to the aims, tenets, or objectives of the IEC.

4.2.1.2 Participate in the IEC's activities and scheduled programs at least once a month.

4.2.1.3 Support and cooperate in efforts towards the improvement and stability of the IEC.

4.2.1.4 Seek the knowledge of Usool-e-Deen and Furoo-e-Deen of Islam and endeavor to practice them.

4.2.1.5 Display good moral character. Furthermore, he or she shall believe in and practice Islamic dress code.

4.2.1.6 Attend at least one of the two scheduled general body meetings of IEC in a year.

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# 4.2.1.7 Pay the membership dues as prescribed by the IEC's Bylaws.

4.2.2 Any serious violation of the above responsibilities may cause renewal of the individual membership to be denied with no obligation to the LEC. The denial of membership renewal shall be affected by the LEC's Board, under the guidance of the Alim as prescribed by the LEC's Bylaws.

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### Article 5. ORGANIZATIONAL FRAMEWORK

The IEC's organizational structure shall consist of the following:

- 2) Resident A'lim
- 3) Trustees
- 4) General Body
- 5) Board of Directors
- 6) Project Committees.

#### 5.1 Advisor

5.1.1 The advisor which refers to the Advisory Alim or the Advisory Council of Ulama in the United States is accepted by the Board of Trustees to resolve any conflict between the

5.1.2 The Advisory A'lim or Ulama must be living in the United States, known in the community, experienced in Islamic laws and activities and willing to accept this sysponsibility.

5.1.3 The Advisory Allim should be a representative of the ecognized Maraja'-el-Taqleed or a Mujvahid himself; his ijtehad is recognized rad known by the Marja'

#### 5.2 **Resident A'lim**

5.2.1 In order to protect the implementation of the ordinance of Islam and the Constitution, a Religious Scholar, hereafter called "the A'lim", shall be nominated by the A'lim Suggestion Committee and approved by the Trustees. A petition defining the cause(s) and documenting the evidence of such perception shall be prepared, signed by at least two-thirds (2/3) of all active members and submitted to the Board of Directors and the Board of Trustees which shall then send such a petition to the Leader or the Leadership Council and await for their judgment. 5.3.1 The trustees shall be the keepers of the IEC's long term assets such as the real estate, on behalf of the Leader with whom the ultimate authority of the assets resides. There shall

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# 5.3.3 Responsibilities

1) Supervise the execution and the continuity of the activities planned by the Board of Directors according to the Constitution.

2) Serve as the link between the Leadership and the Board of Director and community in addition to being the link with the State of Florida.

3) Resolve and diffuse all obstacles and personal conflicts among the Board of Directors, community and/or the A'lim.

4) Should meet bi-annually before the General Assembly to review the bi-annual report submitted by the board of Directors for approval before reading it to the General Assembly.

5) Update all government and State paper work (contracts, tax, accounting, State requirements for continuing non- profit tax-exempt status etc.) necessary to preserve the IEC.

6) Oversee the whole election process and supervise any change in the constitution.

5.3.4 Term of Office


All mostees, except the one elected from the Board of Directors, are permanent positions. However, if one or more of the permanent positions becomes empty due to death, resignation, loss of qualifications, etc., the new trustee(s) shall be suggested by the Board of Directors and approved by the advisery Alim.

### 5.4 General Body

5.4.1 The General Body of the IEC shall consist of, and only of, active members. The IEC's annual budgets and capital expenditures for all short-term and long-term projects shall be presented to the General Body for their information and input. Midyear reports shall be presented to the General Body for their review and information as stipulated in the Bylawy. The General Body shall be empowered to elect or remove members of the Board of Directors in accordance with the procedures described in the IEC's Bylaws.

# 5.5 Board of Directors

5.5.1 The Board of Directors, hereafter called "the Board", shall develop all plaas, policies, and procedures under the guidance of the resident Alim to achieve the mission of IEC. They shall provide necessary assistance and support to the Project Committees (described in Section 5.5 of Article 5) upon request and as needed.



5.5.2 The term of each Director shall be two (2) years from the date of commencement of his term and until his successor has been duly qualified and elected.

5.5.3 The General Body shall elect minimum of five (5) or maximum of nine (9) as a Roard of Directors.

5.5.4 A candidate running for the position of Director shall:

5.5.4.1 Be an active member of the IEC for at least the last six months.

5.5.4.2 Have participated in the project committees of the IEC for at least six (6) months.

5.5.4.3 Refrain from major sins (Kaba'ir) and endeavor to avoid minor sins (Saghe'ir), in addition

5.5.4.4 Have no intentions or known plans for leaving the Tampa Bay Area to reside elsewhere,

5.5.4.5 Be elected by the General Body as a Board member of the IEC.

5.5.4.6 Take oath of office as prescribed in Article 9.

5.5.4.7 Be under the firm Taqleed of one of the recognized Maraja'-e-Taqleed.

5.5.4.8 Be respected for his justice and knowledge of basic Islamic Principles (Ahkam Furoo-e

5.5.5 The election of the positions will be supervised by the Board of Trustees of the IEC.

5.5.6 Scope and Functional Responsibilities of the Board of Directors.

5.5.6.1 Establish policies and guidelines for the efficient operation of the IEC.

5.5.6.2 Develop and/or coordinate the development of all short-term and long-term plans of the IEC including Annual Budget, Capital Expenditures, various project plans, etc., and present them to the General Body for their information.

5.5.6.3 Prepare bi-annual reports for presentation to the General Body.

5.5.6.4 Interpret the constitution and the Bylaws of the IEC under the guidance of the resident

5.5.6.5 Resolve all differences within the General Body with regard to the IEC's activities. Unresolved differences shall be referred to the resident A'lim.

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5.5.6.6 Appoint an Election Committee, approved by the Alim, for conducting the IEC's elections for the Beard of Directors, in accordance with the provisions of the Bylaws of the IEC. This committee is supervised and overseen by the trustees of IEC.

5.5.6.7 Review proposed amendments to the Constitution and seek the approval of the trustees and the A'lim before submitting them to the General Body for ratification in accordance with the provisions of Article 7.

5.5.7 The individual responsibilities of the Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer and other Directors, shall be as prescribed in the IEC's Bylaws.

# 5.6 Project Committees

5.6.1 Any Director of the Board in his personal capacity shall, with the consent of the Board, be authorized and encouraged to formulate Project Committees from the IEC's members to implement approved plans and policies of the Board. Notwithstanding the approval and knowledge of the Board, any Director who utilizes such voluntary services of the IEC's members shall be fully responsible for all acts of such volunteers related to the IEC's work.

5.6.2 Terms of the Project Committees shall be flexible to accommodate all types of projects, whether short-term, long-term, or perpetual in nature.

5.6.3 There shall be Project Committees, each of which shall be headed by an elected Director. These Committees could be:

- 1. Education
- 2. Finance
- 3. Operations
- 4. Publications
- 5. Maintenance
- 6. Records

Additionally, there shall be a Ladies Committee to organize the activities of the IEC women. The chairman of the Board of Directors with the A'lim shall eversee the activities of this committee.

The purpose and function of these committees shall be as described in the Bylaws of the IEC.

5.6.4 Each Project Committee shall be initiated and coordinated by a Director of the Board to accomplish specific approved goals for the project.

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5.6.5 The number of participants in a Project Committee may vary depending on the nature and duration of the project.

5.6.6 A participant in a Project Committee shall:

5.6.6.1 Be an active member of the IEC.

5.6.6.2 Be known to be a good practicing Muslim.

5.7 Removal or Suspension of Director

5.7.1 The majority of the Board of Directors (50% + 1) may decide with the approval of the Alim to temove any Director if it can be determined that the Director's activities are consistently and intentionally contrary to Islamic laws and his qualifications.

5.7.2 A Director may be suspended for a period of at least three (3) months with the consent of the A'lim, if proposed by the remaining majority of the Board and only for the following reasons: neglect of duties, un-Islamic behavior, inexcusable absence in the IEC's programs, misappropriation of the IEC's funds, and a general perception that his continuation as Director would be detrimental to the purpose of the IEC.

5.8 Replacement of Director

5.8.1 Vacancies in the Board of Directors can exist because of any one or more of the following:

5.8 1.1 Insufficient number of Directors are elected in the IEC's election.

5.8.1.2 Removal of a Director as explained in Section 5.6 of this Article.

5.8.1.3 Loss of one or more Directors due to death or resignation.

5.8.2 The remaining Directors shall be empowered to select the next runner-up member of the IEC to fill the vacancy only for the remaining term.

5.8.3 In the event that a runner-up is not available, the vacancy will be filled by an election at a General Body meeting to be held within two (2) months of the vacancy.

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### Article 6. MEETINGS

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No scheduled Board meeting shall conflict with the regularly scheduled programs of the IEC.

### Regularly Scheduled Meetings 6.1

6.1.1 The General Boo, shall meet two (2) times a year: one at the celebration of the Holy Prophet's Birthday and second at the celebration of the Eid-ul-Fitr Day. The purpose of

6.1.1.1 Review past performance including, but not limited to, membership records and books of

6.1.1.2 Discuss current issues and future plans

6.1.1.3 Transact such other business as may properly be brought before the board.

6.1.1.4 Elect the Board of Directors only on the Holy Prophet's Birthday celebration for the

6.1.1.5 The election may be held within two (2) months of the Prophet's birthday by the suggestion of the Board of Directors and approval of the Trustees and The A'lim.

6.1.2.1 General announcements through a newsletter, telephone recording, bulletin board, etc. shall be considered sufficient notice for the General Body meeting.

6.1.2.2 Notifications of election has to be sent through mail to all IEC members.

6.1.3 There shall be a regular monthly Board meeting on the day designated in the Bylaws, with the agenda provided to the A'lim in advance. Members of the IEC are welcome to attend as observers. Minutes of the meeting will be kept and made available by the record director to the board members upon request. The purpose of these meetings will be to review the regular activities, monitor their progress, identify new activities, review future approved plans and to transact any other new business that the Board feels appropriate. No advance notice of such regular meetings shall be required and it shall be the duty of each Director to attend them without notice. Any change to this schedule shall be communicated sufficiently in advance to all

#### 6.2 Special Meetings

time.

6.2.1 Special meetings of the Board with the A'lim may be requested by the Board at any

6.2.2 Special general body meetings of the IEC may be called by the Board or by 51% of the IEC's active members upon a three (3), and not more than thirty (30) day notice along with the stated agenda is sent to IEC members. However, a special meeting called for the purpose of

6.2.3 Special Board meetings may be called at any time by the A'lim or by any Director of the Board upon one(1) day notice by stating the purpose of the meeting.

#### 6.3 Quorum

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6.3.1 In rll IEC's general body meetings, except for the amendment of the constitution, thirty percent (30%) of the active members shall form a quorum. If a quorum is not complete, the meeting shall stand adjourned and postponed to another day at which only twenty percent (20%) of the active members shall form a quorum. In case the attendance in the second time is less than 20% but not less than 10%, the majority of the Board of Directors and the majority of the attendees could then decide to form a quorum for record purposes only, but not to pass a law. Two-thirds (27) 22 11:2 morum shall rule on all matters.

6.3.2 At all Board meetings, the presence of a least 2/3 of Directors shall constitute a quorum. A simple majority shall rule on all matters as described in the Bylaws.

## Article 7. AMENDMENT OR REPEAL OF THE CONSTITUTION

7.1 Amendments to this constitution shall only be considered if it can be determined that they will better achieve the purpose of the IEC. Such amendments shall be proposed, in writing, to the Board by two or more members of the IEC. Approval of the amendments shall be authorized by the A'lim and trustees and submitted to the Board of Directors before ratification by the General Body.

7.2 A two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the total active members shall constitute ratification to the amendments as described in the Bylaws.

## Article 8. DISSOLUTION

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8.1 If the Board of Directors unanimously conclude that the continuation of the IEC has become impossible or undesirable due to financial, political, religious or any other reason, the IEC shall be dissolved in the following manner.

8.1.1 The situation shall be announced to the General Body after consultation with the trustees and the Alim.

8.1.2 There shall be no refunds of any contributions or donations whatsoever.

8.1.3 Thirty (30) days after the announcement, if in the opinion of the existing members of the Board of Directors, there are no promising efforts by the members of the community to save the IEC from dissolution, then the Board of Directors shall start proceedings for dissolving the IEC.

8.1.4 The proceedings for dissolving the IEC shall consist of;

8.1.4.1 Closing all normal activities.

8.1.4.2 Fulfilling all financial obligations of the IEC.

8.1.4.3 Transferring all "waqf assets" and non-waqf assets as approved by the Leader or the Leadership Council.

8.1.4.4 Filing all necessary papers with all concerned agencies of the Government(s).

## GLOSSARY OF TERMS

### Abka'm-e-Furoo'-e-Deen

Ahka'm means doctrine or teachings, Furoo'e-Deen means practices of Islam; thus Ahka'm-e-Furoo'e-Deen means the doctrines or teaching of Islamic practice.

### Ale-Mohammad

Prophet Mohammad's immediate family comprised of the following ma'someen: 1) Ali (son of Hazrat-e-Abu Talib); 2) Fatemah (the beloved daughter of prophet Mohammad and wife of Ali); 3) Hasan (first son of Ali and Fatemah); 4) Husain (second son of Ali and Fatemah). Additionally, the nine (9) selected descendants of Husain (namely: 1. Zain-ul-Abedeen, 2. Mohammad Baqir, 3. Jaffer-us-Sadiq, 4. Musa Kazim, 5. All Raza, 6. Mohammad Tagi, 7. Ali-un-Nagi, 8. Hasan Askari and 9. Mohammad Mehdi) are also considered to belong to the category of Ale-Mohammad. Collectively they are all referred to as the fourteen (14) ma'someen.

#### A'lim

A religious scholar who has been certified by a traditional Islamic religious school, which is recognized by Qum

#### Allah

The One, and only One, God on Whom everything depends, Who does not conceive nor is conceived, and nothing is His equal. God as used in this document refers to Allah. Sura-e-Tawheed defines Allah as follows: Allah is One; Allah is He on Whom all depend; He begets not nor is He begotten and none is like Him,

#### Dbul Bijjah (Zilhaj) The tweifth (12) month of Islam.

A religious scholar with a substantial number of years of study at traditional Islamic schools and one who is well recognized by his peers as having the ability and knowledge to draw conclusions and provide solutions directly from the Qu'an and from traditions of Prophet Mohammad and Ale-Mohammad. In fact the terms 'Mujtahid', 'Faqih' and 'Marja' all refer to Religious Scholars of varying levels of knowledge. Thus, a Faqih is considered more knowledgeable than a Mujtabid and a Marja is considered more

One who is perfect, free of sins and has the responsibility from Allah to protect Islam and to lead Moslims. Mohammad

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Mohammad The last prophet of Allah, whose coming was foretold in the Turah and the New Testament. All prophets are considered 'Ma'soom'. Mo'min One who believes in and strictly practices Islam.
